


## The High Cost Of CASUAL SEX

Each female icon on the chart below represents a partner percentage rounded to 10. Women who had sex with their husband-to-be account for a significant amount of the “only one” premarital partner statistic. [Note: No one collected the same information from males over the same period of time. Interestingly, studies reveal males tend to remember their sexual histories less accurately. **Source: Institute for Family Studies - Counterintuitive Trends in the Link Between Premarital Sex and Marital Stability**




The number of sexual partners women have prior to getting married has risen steadily since the 1970s. In the 2010s, 61% of women reported having 3 or more sexual partners. The alarming consequences of this trend has been a huge increase in marital dissatisfaction, divorce rates and sexually transmitted infections.

“Hooking up” (having casual sex with multiple partners) is also linked to a decrease of marital stability. Women with no premarital partners or only one partner are the LEAST LIKELY to divorce (2-5%). Conversely, women with 10 or more partners are the MOST LIKELY to divorce (20-35%).

Women who enter marriage with children from a previous relationship have disproportionately high divorce rates, and report much lower marital happiness.

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We have great empathy for adults who find themselves in those “higher rate of divorce circumstances, (multiple premarital partners and/or children from previous relationships).

These parents have a much harder job persuading their teen daughters to resist the cultural trends which encourage promiscuity. However, the difference between a 5% chance of divorce and a 30% chance is well worth the effort.

Sadly, the “women’s movement” of the 1970s which fostered the notion that females would find equal satisfaction from multiple sexual partners as males do, is only now being exposed for the fraudulent ideology it was. We can only hope **GenZ** will be wiser than their predecessors.

## COACH'S CORNER

Adolescence is characterized by rebellion. On the one hand this is a very good thing, because it produces an adult who can think for themselves. But rebelling for

rebellion's sake is frustrating for parents. A good coach will look for ways to harness their rebellious ways to advantage.

For instance, **truly rebelling** against the unanimity of the crowd in 2021 would be

- ✓ Religious involvement vs. secularism
- ✓ Practicing sexual self-control vs. hooking up
- ✓ Entering a trade school vs. a liberal arts education
- ✓ Embracing entrepreneurialism vs. socialism
- ✓ Being race-blind vs. advocating racial equity
- ✓ Promoting meritocracy vs. sameness of outcome

A good coach will provide opportunity for their teen to see both sides of any ideology. It is unlikely a teen will be exposed to some of those alternatives without direct parental intervention.

This month's tip is to give your teen a chance to investigate the outcomes of various concepts promoted in their culture. For instance,

1. Introduce them to a Chinese, Cuban or Russian immigrant who can talk about life under socialism or communism.
2. Arrange for your child to shadow someone who left corporate America to start their own business.
3. Pay them to research the impact of increasing the minimum wage, or the quality of end product when incentives for merit are removed.

Experiencing the human consequences of various social ideas will have a longer lasting impact on an adolescent's reasoning ability. It also builds up their defense against peer pressure.
